Her work is based on the generative power of nature, land and water, and emphasized on the color, texture, and the variations of the reflected light on the glass, ceramic and granite tesserae.

Krasimira is interested in the conceptualization and the creation of language-based artworks composed of so many different elements that not a single human being can encounter them all.
